

Looking for Used Cotton Sheets Old-Fashioned Rolled Bandages Make a Comeback



Another request from Kidjip Nazarene Hospital is for clean rolled bandages. Made primarily from old bedsheets, each roll needs to be approximately three inches wide and at least five feet long. Sewing strips together for even longer lengths is encouraged.

The bandages should be rolled tightly and held closed with one big "X" stitch that can be snipped open when the

bandages is actually used.

Fabrics should be as close to 100% cotton as possible. The fabric must "breathe" and allow a good air exchange. The bandages also go through a sterilization process before use.

Dave Dunshee has graciously produced several bandage "winding spoolers," which are distributed among active Missions members. If you have old sheets you are willing to donate, please bring them to church or call Penny Harrison at 838-1947 to arrange pick-up.
